San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby requests review of the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Fontana Water Company division:

This advice letter seeks authorization to reflect in rates \$3,235,000 of San Gabriel's \$5,016,223 investment in the construction of a well and site improvements at Plant F21. The proposed annual revenue increase is \$556,437 or 0.8%. An original and four copies of this advice letter are submitted in compliance with General Order 96-B. This is designated as a **Tier 3 Advice Letter**.

Background

In the last general rate case Decision No. 14-05-001 for the Fontana Water Company division, San Gabriel was authorized to recover the following costs associated with Plant F21, as described in Item II.H.6 of the adopted Settlement Agreement (Appendix A):

"Issue: To meet operational requirements, disinfect the groundwater produced from the well at Plant F21 and meet customer demand in the surrounding area, San Gabriel requested \$3,235,000 to demolish the existing structures at Plant F21, grade the site and construct a replacement well, a water storage reservoir, a

fence and a wall, and other site improvements. DRA recommended the Commission only authorize costs required to add the replacement well and reject all costs associated with the reservoir portion of the project, and that the project remain as an advice letter project. The City recommended that this project be deferred.

RESOLUTION: DRA agrees to San Gabriel's request but San Gabriel will keep this as a Tier 3 Advice Letter project with a capped expenditure of \$3,235,000 and will shift the costs by one year to 2012-2014, as specified in Table 1 above."

This advice letter requests a Commission resolution finding that the Plant F21 project described above is now used and useful, and authorizing San Gabriel's investment, capped at \$3,235,000, in rates.

Discussion

A. Project Description & Construction Costs

The Plant F21 site is located in the southwest region of Fontana Water Company's service area at 10576 Live Oak Avenue in the City of Fontana. Facilities at the site include one active well (F21B) with a production capacity of 2,225 gpm, a 0.53 MG steel water reservoir, a storm water retention basin, and a housed booster station with a pumping capacity of approximately 7,500 gpm.

The Plant F21 project was proposed by San Gabriel in its most recent Fontana Water Company division general rate case (A.11-07-005), and the Commission in D.14-05-001 adopted the settlement between the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA) and San Gabriel that provided for the addition of the cost (capped at \$3,235,000) of this project in rates by an advice letter.

B. Proposed Rate Design

In order to design rates, the following steps were performed: (1) calculate the incremental annual revenue requirement (i.e., Depreciation Expense, Ad Valorem Taxes, Income Taxes, and Return on Rate Base) using Commission-adopted quantities, and (2) increasing present rates proportionately by the calculated percentage increase in revenue requirement. It was determined that a revenue increase of \$556,437 or 0.8% is needed to support the capped \$3,235,000 investment. Accordingly, San Gabriel proposes to increase each component of its base rates by 0.8%.

Supporting Workpapers

San Gabriel has furnished to the Commission staff for its review and verification, workpapers supporting the above-described capital expenditures, the incremental revenue requirement based on those expenditures, and the proposed rate design.

Service and Notice

Distribution of this Advice Letter is being made to the attached service lists in accordance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order 96-B. San Gabriel will also post this Advice Letter on its website in accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.3. No further public notice is required because all public notices in connection with Application No. 11-07-005 have already been made in accordance with applicable law and Commission rules.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) San Gabriel did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which San Gabriel relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a response or protest is:

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The customer will pay, without refund, the entire cost of the private fire service facilities.
2. The private fire service facilities shall be installed by the utility or under the utility's direction and shall be the sole property and subject to the control of the utility, with the right to alter, repair, replace and the right to remove upon discontinuance of service.
3. The minimum diameter for the private fire service connection will be 4-inches. The maximum diameter shall not be larger than the diameter of the water main to which the private fire service facilities are attached unless said main is circulating, in which case with the approval of the utility the maximum diameter may be larger by not more than 2-inches than the diameter of said circulating main.
4. If a water main of adequate size is not available adjacent to the premises to be served, then a new main from the nearest existing main of adequate size will be installed by the utility at the cost of the customer. Such cost shall not be subject to refund.
5. The private fire service facilities will include a detector check valve or other similar device acceptable to the utility which will indicate the use of water. The facilities may be located within the customer's premises or within public right of way adjacent thereto. Where located within the premises, the utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right of ingress to and egress from the premises for all purposes related to said facilities. In the event the installation is solely a private fire hydrant facility, the requirement for a detector check valve or other similar device may be waived.

3. When each house passes final inspection water service under this schedule will be terminated.

1. Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum account is to track the Quantity Rate revenues collected under Schedule FO-1C tiered rates against the revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the WRAM memorandum Account in the Fontana Water Company division:
 - a. The recorded revenues collected through the tiered Quantity Rate under Schedule No. FO-1C (debit).
 - b. The calculated revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate for the same water usage as in 2a above (credit).
 - c. The CPUC-adopted Quantity Rates (\$/Ccf) to be used in calculating the revenues for 2a and 2b above are as follows:

- d. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on the net of 2a and 2b above, and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible expenses.
 - e. Monthly interest calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www.federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication.
3. The balance in the memorandum account shall be amortized by a Tier 1 advice letter whenever the balance exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for the preceding calendar year. If the balance is below 2%, San Gabriel shall propose its amortization in a general rate case.
4. The memorandum account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
