San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby requests ministerial review of the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Fontana Water Company division:

An original and four copies of this supplemental advice letter are submitted in to implement a revenue decrease of \$26,600 for Escalation Year 2014-2015. As a result of discussions with Commission staff, Advice Letter 440-A reduced the requested increase in Advice Letter 440 from \$372,600 to \$346,000. Advice Letter 440-B proposed that the annualized \$26,600 difference be refunded through a one-time refund of \$0.18 per customer on bills issued during the month of October 2014. This Advice Letter 440-C is submitted to eliminate rate design issues by updating the "present rates" from those in effect at the time Advice Letter 440 was submitted to the CPUC-approved rates currently in effect. **This supplemental advice letter is designated as Tier 2.**

Discussion

On May 16, 2014, San Gabriel submitted Advice Letter 440, requesting an escalation year increase of \$372,600. Since the advice letter was designated as Tier 1, the proposed rates became effective on July 1, 2014.

On August 15, 2014, San Gabriel submitted supplemental Advice Letter 440-A, incorporating certain recommendations made by the Office of Ratepayer Advocates, reducing the escalation year increase to \$346,000. San Gabriel proposed to record the over-collected revenues in its Water Production balancing account.

On September 5, 2014, San Gabriel submitted supplemental Advice Letter 440-B, proposing the same \$346,000 escalation year increase, but instead of recording the over-collected revenues in its Water Production balancing account, San Gabriel proposed instead to make a one-time refund of \$0.18 per customer during the month of October 2014.

This third supplemental advice letter is submitted to eliminate rate design issues associated with Advice Letter 440-B by updating the “present rates” on which the proposed rate changes are based from those that were in effect when Advice Letter 440 was submitted to those rates currently in effect. This causes small changes to the rates that were proposed in Advice Letter 440-B, and re-labels San Gabriel’s proposal (in addition to the one-time refund) as a revenue requirement decrease.

The tariff schedules reflecting the Escalation Increase are attached hereto. San Gabriel has provided workpapers supporting the calculation of the earnings test and the proposed rates, to the Commission’s Water and Audits Division staff for their review.

Distribution of this Advice Letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order 96-B and San Gabriel will post this Advice Letter on its website in accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.3. No further public notice is required because all public notices in connection with Application No. 11-07-005 have already been made in accordance with applicable law and Commission rules.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The customer will pay, without refund, the entire cost of the private fire service facilities.
2. The private fire service facilities shall be installed by the utility or under the utility's direction and shall be the sole property and subject to the control of the utility, with the right to alter, repair, replace and the right to remove upon discontinuance of service.
3. The minimum diameter for the private fire service connection will be 4-inches. The maximum diameter shall not be larger than the diameter of the water main to which the private fire service facilities are attached unless said main is circulating, in which case with the approval of the utility the maximum diameter may be larger by not more than 2-inches than the diameter of said circulating main.
4. If a water main of adequate size is not available adjacent to the premises to be served, then a new main from the nearest existing main of adequate size will be installed by the utility at the cost of the customer. Such cost shall not be subject to refund.
5. The private fire service facilities will include a detector check valve or other similar device acceptable to the utility which will indicate the use of water. The facilities may be located within the customer's premises or within public right of way adjacent thereto. Where located within the premises, the utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right of ingress to and egress from the premises for all purposes related to said facilities. In the event the installation is solely a private fire hydrant facility, the requirement for a detector check valve or other similar device may be waived.
- 5a. Pursuant to Advice Letter 440-C, bills issued during the month of October 2014 will include a one-time refund of \$0.18 per customer.

APPLICABILITY

Applicable to water service for house construction where houses are being constructed as part of a real estate development.

TERRITORY

Portions of Fontana, Rancho Cucamonga, Rialto and vicinity, San Bernardino County

RATES

For each lot for the construction period . . . \$12.36

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. This service is available only to real estate developers or builders who make application prior to installation of mains and services and who undertake the construction of houses as part of the development. At its option the utility may provide the service if application is made after mains and services have been installed.
2. Water service under this tariff schedule is only to be used for house construction. It does not include water use for landscaping or other tract improvement work.
3. When each house passes final inspection water service under this schedule will be terminated.
4. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. AA-UF.
5. Pursuant to Advice Letter 440-C, bills issued during the month of October 2014 will include a one-time refund of \$0.18 per customer. (N)

J. Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) Memorandum Account For Fontana Water Company Division

1. Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum account is to track the Quantity Rate revenues collected under Schedule FO-1C tiered rates against the revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the WRAM memorandum Account in the Fontana Water Company division:
 - a. The recorded revenues collected through the tiered Quantity Rate under Schedule No. FO-1C (debit).
 - b. The calculated revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate for the same water usage as in 2a above (credit).
 - c. The CPUC-adopted Quantity Rates (\$/Ccf) to be used in calculating the revenues for 2a and 2b above are as follows:

- d. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on the net of 2a and 2b above, and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible expenses.
- e. Monthly interest calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www.federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication.
3. The balance in the memorandum account shall be amortized by a Tier 1 advice letter whenever the balance exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for the preceding calendar year. If the balance is below 2%, San Gabriel shall propose its amortization in a general rate case.
4. The memorandum account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
