TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby requests review and approval of the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Fontana Water Company ("Fontana") division:

An original and four copies of this supplemental advice letter are submitted pursuant to General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(1), to amortize a portion of the undercollection in the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) Balancing Account as of December 31, 2015, through a temporary 23-month surcharge of \$0.1352 per Ccf applicable only to the non-CARW customers. On February 22, 2016 San Gabriel submitted Advice Letter 475 to amortize the undercollected balance and began billing, subject to refund, the proposed \$0.1352 per Ccf surcharge. The Division of Water and Audits has identified a small error in the supporting workpapers. San Gabriel has made the correction and now proposes to shorten the amortization period by several weeks, terminating on January 31, 2018, while maintaining the originally proposed \$0.1352 per Ccf surcharge. San Gabriel requests

the revised \$3,571,664 balance be moved to the Previously Authorized Balances Balancing Account. The January 1, 2016 beginning balance in the CARW Balancing Account for the Fontana Water Company Division will be reset to \$0.

In accordance with Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(1) of General Order 96-B, **this filing is designated as Tier 1**. The enclosed tariff schedules will become effective upon the filing of this advice letter.

Background

Standard Practice U-27-W, Section E.43 states:

43. Reserve Account amortization for Class A utilities will be part of the General Rate Case or may be by advice letter when the account over or under collection exceeds 2%, at the utility's option.

The current rate schedules in this division became effective on November 19, 2015 through Advice Letter No. 470.

San Gabriel maintains a low-income customer assistance program called the California Alternative Rates for Water program in its Fontana Water Company division. This program implements the Commission's Water Action Plan objective to assist qualified low-income customers. Until May 2014, San Gabriel's CARW program provided low-income assistance by offering qualified low-income customers with a meter size of 1" or smaller a 50% discount on the service charge. D.14-05-001 modified the CARW benefit to be \$8, \$10, or \$20 per month, depending on the meter size. San Gabriel established the CARW Memorandum Account authorized by D.05-05-015 in A.03-04-025 to track the costs of the program against the estimates reflected in rates.

Decision 11-05-020 in Rulemaking 09-12-017 established a data sharing plan between regulated Class A water utilities and regulated energy utilities which resulted in a large increase in low-income customer participation and a subsequent rapid increase in the undercollection of the CARW Balancing Account.

Discussion

Ordering Paragraph No. 1 of Resolution W-5043, dated July 23, 2015 approved Advice Letter No. 453 which authorized the change of San Gabriel's CARW memorandum accounts to CARW balancing accounts stating:

- 1. San Gabriel Valley Water Company's request to re-designate its California Alternative Rates for Water memorandum accounts as balancing accounts is approved.*

San Gabriel has furnished the Commission's Division of Water and Audits staff workpapers providing detailed support for the proposed surcharge. These workpapers show the computation of a surcharge of \$0.1352 per Ccf for twenty-three months beginning on the submittal date of the advice letter. The new rates submitted with this advice letter will raise the monthly bill of the average residential customer on Schedule FO-1 with a 5/8" x 3/4" meter using 19 Ccf by \$2.57 or 3.5% from \$73.81 to \$76.38 and on Schedule No. FO-1C by \$2.57 or 3.4% from \$74.54 to \$77.11.

The requested amortization is not now the subject of any formal filings including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

Notice of Rate Increase

In accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.2 of General Order 96-B, as modified by Commission Resolution W-4664, San Gabriel informed its customers of the increase by bill insert (a copy of which was provided with the workpapers) in the first bill that included the increased rates. No other parties have requested notification of tariff filings related to the Fontana Water Company division.

In accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.3 of General Order 96-B, San Gabriel will also post this advice letter on its website at www.fontanawater.com.

Also, distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order No. 96-B.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. When submitting a written response or protest please include San Gabriel Valley Water Company's name and this advice letter number in the subject line. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) San Gabriel did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which San Gabriel relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. When submitting a written response or protest please include San Gabriel Valley Water Company's name and this advice letter number in the subject line. 1. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. AA-UF.
2. A surcredit of \$0.1047 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates for the remainder of the thirty-six months ending on July 31, 2017 to refund an overcollection associated with the Sandhill Water Treatment Facility Plant.
3. A surcharge of \$0.2408/Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates of only non-CARW customers to recover the estimated benefits provided under the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) program.
4. A surcharge of \$0.1440 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates for thirty-one months beginning on February 13, 2015 and ending on September 12, 2017 to recover an undercollection recorded in the Interim Rates Memorandum Account.
5. A surcharge of \$0.1257 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates for twenty-four months beginning on May 6, 2015 and ending on May 5, 2017 to recover the March 2015 undercollection recorded in the Water Production Balancing Account.
6. A surcharge of \$0.1394 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates for a twelve month period beginning on October 27, 2015 to amortize the undercollection in the Water Quality Litigation Memorandum Account (WQLMA).
7. A surcharge of \$0.1352 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates of non-CARW customers for twenty-three months beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 475-A and ending on January 31, 2018 to amortize the undercollection in the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) Balancing Account. 7. A surcharge of \$0.1617 per Ccf for an 11-month period beginning on August 27, 2015 is to be applied to the quantity rate to amortize the undercollection in the Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) Balancing Account.

A surcharge of \$0.1352 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates of non-CARW customers for twenty-three months beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 475-A and ending on January 31, 2018 to amortize the undercollection in the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) Balancing Account. 3. The utility will supply only such recycled water at such pressure as may be available from time to time from the recycled water system. The customer shall indemnify the utility and save it harmless against any and all claims arising out of service under this schedule and shall further agree to make no claims against the utility for any loss or damage resulting from service under this schedule.
4. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. AA-UF.
5. A surcredit of \$0.1047 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates for remainder of the thirty-six months ending on July 31, 2017 to refund an overcollection associated with the Sandhill Water Treatment Facility Plant.
6. A surcharge of \$0.2408/Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates of only non-CARW customers to recover the estimated benefits provided under the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) program.

A surcharge of \$0.1352 per Ccf is to be applied to the quantity rates of non-CARW customers for twenty-three months beginning on the effective date of Advice Letter 475-A and ending on January 31, 2018 to amortize the undercollection in the California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) Balancing Account. G2. California Alternative Rates for Water (CARW) Balancing Account For The Fontana Water Company Division

1. Purpose: The purpose of the balancing account is to track the costs of the program against the estimates reflected in rates, until sufficient experience with the CARW program is attained that such costs can be reliably forecast in a general rate case proceeding.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the CARW Balancing Account in the Fontana Water Company division:
 - a. The recorded reduction in billed Service Charge revenues for service provided under Schedule No. FO-CARW (debit).
 - b. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on 2a above and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible accounts expense (credit).
 - c. CARW program costs of performing incremental activities which would not have been incurred absent the CARW program and which have not been reflected in authorized rates (debit).
 - d. One-twelfth of the annual CPUC-adopted revenue reduction for the CARW program as reflected in rates (credit)¹. These CPUC-adopted amounts are as follows:

- The above amounts will be proportionately adjusted when monthly service charges change.
- c. Monthly interest expense calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www/federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication (debit or credit).
 3. The balancing account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
 4. Balances approved for amortization shall be moved to the Previously Authorized Balances Balancing Account (PABBA) and shall earn interest according to Paragraph 2e above. (N)
